CLUB ONE UPDATE



The Senate Committee on Pre Commitment has released its first report. It has made 43 Recommendations that describe how to implement and manage a Mandatory Pre Commitment scheme for Australia. The report can be directly attributed to the Gillard Willkie Pact signed to secure the vote of Mr. Willkie MHR to p The remit of the committee can be summarised as being to recommend a Mandatory Pre Commitment (MPC) scheme for Australian Electronic Gaming Machines. It argued for

“a broad population based approach, precommitment will hinder the progression of EGM players from no risk to at risk”.

In other words anyone who plays (and perhaps those who might play?) has to be treated – this overcomes the problem that less than 2% of the population is a problem gambler. As it is a figure that is too low for some to support such a national expense when there are indigenous people living in third world conditions and problems funding major health issues such as diabetes and cancer.

In the report two recommendations stand out: Recommendation 4

4.28 The committee recommends that in line with the Productivity Commission Recommendations a public health approach to problem gambling be adopted across jurisdictions with a view to reducing the levels of problem gambling.

Recommendation 28

6.133 The committee recommends that a national independent regulatory body be established by the end of 2011 to oversee mandatory pre-commitment and associated reforms in all Australian jurisdictions.

What is the public health approach? In From past to present; the changing focus of public health. by **Maria Joyce**

(eprints.lincoln.ac.uk/1839/2/Public_health_paper.doc) Maria described Public health - "the new ideology" that "may be taken to mean the promotion of healthy lifestyles linked to behaviour and individual responsibility supported by government action; whereas traditionally the description tended to relate more to sanitary reform and 'healthy conditions'.

She noted that 'new public health' differs from the earlier form "in the way it increases the scope of surveillance, gears behaviour to health targets and generalises danger." Bennett and DiLorenzo (1999) accuse 'new public health' of 'nannying' and imposing moral regulation on the population. A position further supported by commentators stating that:

'The new public health can be seen as but the most recent of a series of regimes of power and knowledge that are orientated to the regulation and surveillance of individual bodies and the social body as a whole' (Peterson and Lupton 1996, p3). Recommendation 4 is then a recommendation for an ideology. To carry out that ideology, recommendation 28 sets up a new body of inspectors and enforcers "to oversee mandatory pre-commitment and associated reforms in all Australian jurisdictions" In other words a new bureaucracy to manage and sustain the ongoing control of gaming machines. This will mean in South Australia there will be three bodies of supervision, this proposed new National Regulatory Body, The Independent Gambling Authority (IGA) and the Office of Liquor and Gambling Commissioner (OLGC). To this can be added the work of the Department of Families and Communities (DFC) and the police and all the welfare agencies and the Advertiser and numerous radio stations and columnists.

Not only does this make the local punter a much examined individual, but it is an expensive and growing drain on the taxpayer and a diversion of monies from existing programs - and all for a prevalence rate of problem gamblers that is less than 2% of the population; a number that has been decreasing - without any assistance from new bureaucracies and ideologies.
